Dear Parents and Community Members,
The annual report card issued by the Oregon Department of Education provides the district, community members, and parents with data in certain areas related to Elgin School District students. Growth and achievement ratings in reading and math are provided along with data from key student groups, School Readiness, Academic Enrichment, and Extracurricular Activities. The U. S. Department of Education has given the State of Oregon approval to temporarily suspend the assignment of school ratings during the transition from NCLB to the new college and career readiness assessments. Schools will not receive an overall school rating on this report card, and will receive a new overall school rating on the 2016-17 school report cards.

Continued improvement can be expected over the course of this school year, with a goal of 5 in the future. A rating of 5 would put us in the top 10% of schools in the state.

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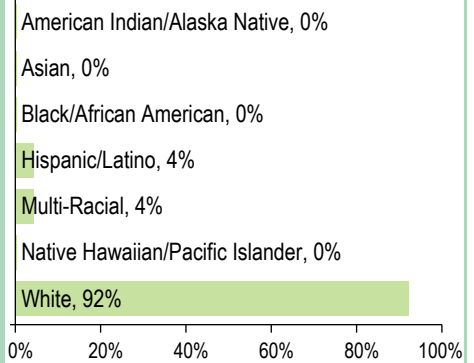

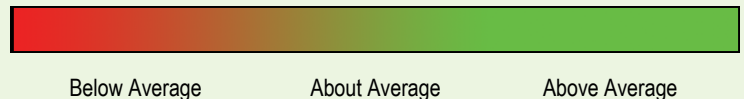
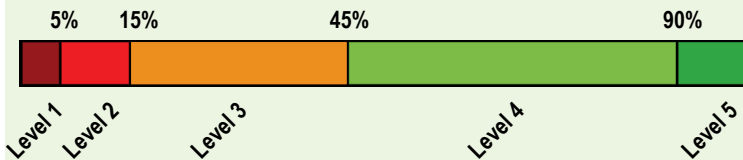
